Jeffrey Scott Freebairn, 49, passed away unexpectedly on October 15, 2020 in Utah of a pulmonary embolism. Jeff was born in Salt Lake City, Utah on May 23, 1971 to Mary P and Robert D Freebairn. Jeff is survived by his two beloved children, Pierce and Mireille Freebairn, brother Robert (Shauna) Freebairn and sister Meredith (Mike) Mackris. Preceded in death by both his parents. He will be missed.

Jeff was always an intellectually curious person, from childhood until his death. A voracious reader, avid photographer. He enjoyed documenting daily observations, successes and admitting to challenges he faced. To all those who supported him in the past, thank you for all the love, he appreciated it.
