Karl David Bryner, age 65, husband of Linda Sachs Bryner, passed away Tuesday, November 23rd, 2021. Born on May 4th, 1956, in Idaho Falls, was the son of Barbara and Dean Bryner. He went to Olympus high school and served a LDS mission in Ohio.

In Karl's younger years, he worked at Utah Power and Light, but he spent most of his life as a safety professional and educator in the construction industry.
